### **Hundreds of Butterflies Fill the Robinsons-May Pavilion of Wings April 17, 2005**

- What:** Two of the most popular family attractions return this spring to the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County.

- Admission:** The Pavilion of Wings: A Live Butterfly Experience is located outside the Museum on the South Lawn. A separate admission ticket applies. Tickets are \$3 for adults, \$1 for children and \$2 for students/seniors. Tickets are sold for entry times on the half-hour.
- Pavilion of Wings** Back for its seventh summer, the **Robinsons-May Pavilion of Wings** will open Sunday, April 17, and run through Monday, September 5 (Labor Day).
- Highlights:** The Natural History Museum's live butterfly exhibition lets visitors experience free-flying butterflies while strolling through a native landscaped pavilion on the Museum's South Lawn. Through the summer, some 7,000 individual butterflies and moths will call the Pavilion home. Included among the 30 U.S. native butterfly and moth species are the giant swallowtail, the monarch, the American painted lady and our official state butterfly, the California dogface. Guests of all ages will watch butterflies visit flowers in search of nectar, observe caterpillars feeding, learn which garden plants attract butterflies and even witness an adult emerging from its chrysalis.
