### ***Spider Pavilion September 25 through November 6***

Safely watch spiders in their natural habitat as gallery interpreters guide small groups through the Natural History Museum's new *Spider Pavilion*. Located in a greenhouse exhibition area, Orb Weaver arachnids such as the Golden Silk and the Banded Garden interact with various Jewel and other Garden spiders. The result: magnificent cobwebs.
