Los Angeles leaders unveil a new 9/11 memorial in Hancock Park in memory of the lives lost on Flight 77.

WHAT: Miracle Mile resident Brad Burlingame will join city leaders on Thursday, October 12, 2006, to dedicate a new 9/11 memorial honoring the flight crew and passengers of American Airlines Flight 77. Brad's brother and Flight 77's pilot, Charles Burlingame, perished along with 58 others on September 11, 2001, when the plane, destined for Los Angeles, crashed into the Pentagon. Continuing a project of tree dedication in Hancock Park, the memorial will serve as a place for Angelenos to remember those lost on 9/11, many of whom were Los Angeles residents.

Hosted by the Page Museum at the La Brea Tar Pits, the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County, the Hollywood/Los Angeles Beautification Team, and the Miracle Mile Civic Coalition in cooperation with Los Angeles County Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky, District 3; Councilmember Tom LaBonge, C64; the Los Angeles Police Department; and the Los Angeles Fire Department.
