

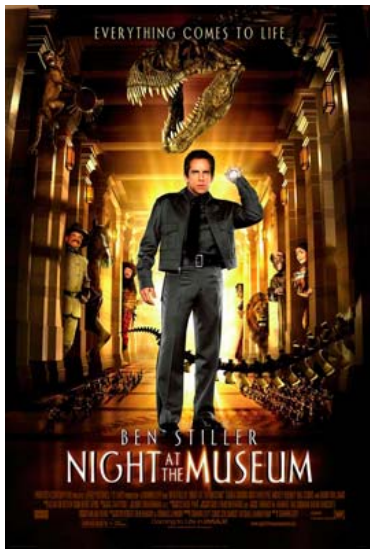

## NHM Debuts *Night At The Museum*-Inspired Prop Exhibit

*Visit the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County for a chance to see your favorite props and costumes from the film*

**LOS ANGELES** – *Night At The Museum*, the “romping, stomping good ride” (San Francisco Chronicle) family comedy, brings its cast of characters to the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County just in time for Twentieth Century Fox Home Entertainment to release the box office smash on DVD and Blu-ray Disc April 24. Opening April 25 and running through September 16, the Museum will play host to the movie’s memorable props, giving visitors an up-close look at the very objects which magically came to life on the silver screen. Joining one of the world’s most extensive and valuable collections of natural and cultural history, the exhibit will debut in the newly revamped Director’s Gallery, a beautiful array of original set decoration, hand-props, and photographs from the film’s production.
