The Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County serves more than one million families and visitors annually, and is a national leader in research, exhibitions and education. The Museum was the first dedicated museum building in Los Angeles, opening its doors in 1913. It has amassed one of the world's most extensive and valuable collections of natural and cultural history — with more than 35 million objects, some as old as 4.5 billion years. NHM Next

The completed renovation of the Natural History Museum's Beaux-Arts 1913 Building sets the stage for the Museum's rollout of new visitor experiences leading up to the Museum's centennial in 2013. The milestone re-opening of the 1913 Building will begin in Summer 2010 with new exhibitions inside its iconic Rotunda and the *Age of Mammals* galleries. In Summer 2011, the Museum will open *Dinosaur Mysteries*, the highly-anticipated return of a dedicated dinosaur hall. *Under the Sun*, an exhibition focusing on the Southern California environmental history will open in Spring 2012
